Teaching-Learning	The college has 33 permanent teachers. There are about 30 guest faculties in College. All the nine departments with UG programmes conduct entry level tests for students and identify the slow, average and fast learners. Teachers prepare lesson plan, maintain Teacher's Diary showing schedule of teaching, conduct tests, organize seminars and evaluate assignments. The college follows student centric methods like peer teaching, experiential learning, problem solving methodologies, flipped class rooms etc. to enhance the learning experience. Most of the faculty members utilise LMS like MOODLE, Google classroom etc. Purchase of LMS software EMBASE is in progress. All the departments conduct Bridge course for UG students and Department of Chemistry conducts Bridge course in Mathematics for PG students.

The number of computers available for academic purpose is ample for the students. Most of the faculty members utilize LMS like MOODLE, google classroom etc. Cafeteria, Canteen and Car Parking facilities are provided in the campus.

Internet facility is available in the main block, library and in Department for students. Regular budget is allocated by the management and from PD fund to purchase books in the library as per the revised curriculum. The college library is partially automated with about 36547 books.
