FEEDBACK MECHANISM

Various stakeholders like students, teachers, employers, alumni etc. actively participate in the mechanism by providing feedback through structured forms. Feedback is collected annually to gauge satisfaction with academic programs, curriculum, and overall services. A dedicated feedback committee collects and compiles data, which is presented before the College Level Monitoring Committee (CLMC) and the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC). The IQAC analyses all feedback data and based on the analysis, recommendations and plans are put forward to improve and enhance college services and strengthen the institution's reputation. The consolidated reports are also presented to the College Academic Council for informed decision-making. Action plans are developed accordingly by gathering suggestions from all bodies and timely implementation of suggestions are ensured by the institution.

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

Students Feedback Report


The institution conducts feedback surveys every year from students in online mode to evaluate and assess the pros and cons of the institution. Feedback reports are then presented at CLMC meetings to analyse and take necessary steps for improvement. Among the students who participated in the survey, 77.4% were females and 22.6% were males. The feedback questionnaire addresses the curriculum and learning related issues, quality of teaching, internal evaluation mechanism, delivery of curriculum etc.



1. How much of the syllabus was covered in the class?


The student survey clearly indicates that a huge fraction of students are of the opinion that 85-100% of syllabus is covered in the class, indicating a good academic atmosphere.

2. How well were the teachers able to communicate?




The communication of teachers with students is of great importance. Major fraction of students (around 57%) opinionated it as very effective and 37% considered it as effective.

3. The teaching method of the teacher can be best described as:



4. Does the teacher explain the concepts through examples and applications?



5. Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teacher


The college ensures effective internal evaluation through various methods and the fairness of the evaluation process seems to be acceptable among students as per the survey.

6. Does the teacher inform you about the expected course outcomes and program outcomes?





7. Teacher's control over the class




The control over the class by the teachers is considered excellent (50%) or very good (42.3%), by the students as per the survey.

8. The regularity of the teacher



The feedback analysis gave a mixed opinion indicating more student centric approaches can be included for better learning experience.




10. Does the teacher discuss your performance with you?

Major fraction of students opined that teachers discuss the students' performance with them very often.


<u>Alumni Feedback Report</u>

1. Rate the overall environment, infrastructure and facilities of the institution




The overall environment, infrastructure and facilities at the institution were given a mixed review.




2. The faculty of the institution are

Most alumni consider the faculty of the institution to be excellent, which is the biggest strength of the institution.




3. Quality of teaching and study materials provided

4. Training and placement assistance provided by the institution


Mixed opinion again was seen with regard to training and placement assistance, which shows that the institution has to do a better job of supporting employment possibilities.




5. Library facility




7. Are you proud to be associated with D B College as an Alumni?




1. The vision, philosophy & objectives are referred to and reflected in college decisions

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
Most faculty believe that the decisions taken uphold the vision and objectives of the institution.

2. Institution constantly provides adequate opportunities and support to upgrade your skill and qualifications





The institution welcomes all sorts of opportunities to upgrade and update the skills and qualifications of the faculty.

3. Books, journals etc. listed as reference materials are up to date and available in library in adequate numbers




Few departments raised concern over the lack of reference materials in adequate numbers in the library, which has to be addressed and resolved.






The feedback report emphasizes that the institution has given maximum freedom to the faculty to adopt and deliver new teaching and assessment techniques.



5. Equal opportunities for all staff is provided


Majority agreed that equal opportunity is given to all staff in various administrative bodies and other activities of the institution.

6. Rest rooms, toilets, laboratory, playground, classrooms, library are clean and well maintained






7. College pays attention to conservation of environment and has taken initiative on implementing waste management practices




The report demonstrates the faculty's desire for more focus and initiatives to implement innovative waste management strategies and practices that will make the campus greener.





The report shows that data and document maintenance can be made better and easier with DMS






The faculty recommended adding additional ICT-enabled classrooms to improve curriculum delivery.

The syllabus of all the programmes offered at the institution were attached with the form, so that the employers can go through the structure of the syllabus.




1. Skills acquired from the curriculum

2. Applicability/relevance of the curriculum to real life situations


The response gave an overall positive impression regarding the curriculum's real-world applicability with 80% of respondents finding the curriculum relevant.

4. Whether the curriculum is updated enough to the requirements in respective disciplines?




The feedback on the curriculum's timeliness in meeting industry demands presents a picture with both positive aspects and areas for exploration.

Evaluation of Feedback Reports

During the academic year 2021-2022, both online and offline modes of teaching were adopted as colleges had to close due to the COVID pandemic. According to feedback reports from students, the institution's prime strengths lie in the quality of teaching and curriculum delivery. Students expressed satisfaction with the teaching methods and evaluation processes in both online and offline modes.

The alumni feedback report highlighted the need for improving infrastructure facilities and providing better placement assistance to students. The majority of students rated the faculty as excellent and praised the outstanding teaching at the institution.

Feedback collected from faculty pointed out a few areas for improvement, including making more classrooms ICT-enabled, implementing a Document Management System (DMS) for better data documentation, and developing and maintaining classrooms, labs, and toilets. Additionally, faculty members appreciated the freedom to adopt new teaching and evaluation strategies and acknowledged the institution's support in enhancing their skills.

The feedback report from employers were generally encouraging results, though there's always room for improvement. It's crucial to analyse and understand specific areas for enhancement and ensure the course and curriculum continue to effectively prepare students for the future.
