World Environmental day was celebrated by planting trees in the college campus on 5th June 2018. The students of 2017-18 batch brought saplings of trees and planted them in the college premises.




Save Environment: Save Biodiversity campaign



ECOFRIENDLY PRODUCTS -A DRIVE TOWARDS SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

Department of Botany organized a Talk on 'Ecofriendly Products- A drive towards Sustainable development' on 19/3/2021. The speaker of the session was Mr. Shijo Joy, Alumnus of the Department. Mr. Shijo shared the research experience of making biodegradable straw using Plant materials and gave an account of the plants screened and techniques adopted for straw preparation. The speaker stressed the importance of such biodegradable straws over the

conventional plastic straws which caused considerable environmental pollution. 75 UG students attended the webinar.

SPECIAL LECTURE ON GLOBAL ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES: POLICIES AND CHALLENGES



SEMINAR ON MULTIDISCIPLINARY ASPECT OF ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE












BIODIVSERSITY CONSERVATION INITIATIVES

The speaker could deliver the talk on biodiversity and its beauty in a quite different way with beautiful presentation of photographs that reflected minute aspects of nature's beauty. This created great enthusiasm among the participants and conveyed the necessity of urgent conservation efforts for sustaining this wealth.

TOPIC: BUCKING THE BIODIVERSITY CRISIS: WHY DO PEOPLE NATURE LINKAGES MATTER?



On 14.06.2021, a National Webinar was conducted as part of Medha Webinar Series. This was jointly organized by Department of Botany and IQAC. 


