The Department of English organized 8 lecture series of 'Sameeksha'. 'Kanthari- Season 2 was organized with a cause to collect money for the medical treatment of Ambily S Rangan, who met an accident.

In collaboration with the Kerala Excise Department, Quiz Competition and Poster Designing on 'Anti Drug Abuse' were organized. They also conducted an Exhibition of paintings, a workshop on art and a seminar of paintings. A Manuscript Canopy was also released.

The Department of Mathematics organized a one day Career enrichment programme for school teachers and B.Ed Students. A Mathematics Manuscript "A step to the world of Mathematics" was released.

The Department of Zoology jointly with the Biodiversity club conducted a programme in the auditorium by displaying medicinal plants and distributing karkidaka kanji. EJECTA, the house magazine of physics Association was also released. Department conducted a training session for the B Sc students in LED bulb making.

In collaboration with Kerala Sastra Sahitya Parishad, Dept of Botany was able to Co Ordinate *Vijnanotsavam 2016-17* on the 14th of January 2017 for UP and High school students. The Lab was open to the students familiarizing all the innovative experiments and equipments used in the UG lab. An
